May 19th Fun Float/ Float Fly-In

Saturday, May 19th was our first-ever joint event with the Charles River Radio Controllers (CRRC) airplane club. The event was held on Lake Cochituate at the Wayland Town Swim Beach. It was an absolutely gorgeous day, weather-wise-- perhaps too nice, and that is why we didn't get more members in attendance???

All told, we have six members present: Bob Okerholm, Bill Michaels, Alan Beeber; Arthur Perlmutter; Glen Williams, Don Murray, and Mike Hale. Bill, Mike, and Bob had all brought models suitable for performing rescues—and they were kept busy. By the end of the day, we must have rescued at least 10 downed or stalled airplanes, including some big ones, and some pretty far out from shore.

The event well—we were at one end of the beach, and had a nice shady spot, and plenty of room to run out boats any time we wanted to. There were no problems with the mix of aircraft and boats.



The CRRC members were VERY appreciative of our presence. They enjoyed seeing the models run, and they also were impressed with how fast we could get out to a stalled plane with a tug and push it back to shore. The few times the guy manning the rowboat went out, it took him twice as long (or more) to get on scene.



In addition to rescuing planes and an airboat, we also had to rescue one of our own—no less than Commander Bob Okerholm's Safe Sea, which had an electrical failure while well offshore. Mike Hale's big tug easily bought Bob's boat back to shore, while Bill Michaels' little Springer tug struggled to keep up. The consensus of the folks attending was that this is a worthwhile event, and one we should do again. I was so busy having a good time, I forgot to take many pictures. Fortunately, Bob Okerholm and Alan Beeber were paying attention, too.

Bill Michaels finished his Springer tug the day before the event. The model is a standard Springer hull, fitted with a couple of removable rescue booms. The booms are dowels that snap into place, with a foam pad on the end. Model has a 2.5:1 gearbox and a 50mm prop—it isn't real fast, but has a lot of pushing power.
