Shaun Kimball brought along his new tug Goliath. He described it as:

The measurements for my new tugboat I named the Goliath that I got off of Ed are approximately 2 feet 8 inches long, 1 foot 8 inches tall (from keel to tip of the tallest mast), and is 9 inches wide. The boat also weighs about 10lbs and goes 2-3 mph. I talked to Ed and he said it was not a kit and that it came built from a company called Imex and was an almost ready to run model.

On a comical note, when I had the Goliath on her second sea trial here at my apartment complex I had about 16 fish following the boat. All were about 6-8 inches long I think. Might be a good way for me to go fishing maybe....





Mike Fioretti brought along some new (at least to me) models. The big one is a USCG 40 footer.

Mike said the 40 foooter is not the old Dumas kit—rather, it was scratch built from plans. Mike said the plans had a several errors, and it took a good bit of effort to fix! Mike also said that the speedboat is a is really a water-jet powered boat---- powered by a Rule 800 GPH bilge pump. He said the water outlet (which he designed himself) is steerable, and that the boat isn't very fast, but does run nicely.

Editor's Notes

Plastic Model news: Merit international has announced a new 80 foot Elco PT Boat kit. The kit is in 1/48 scale (1/4 inch to the foot), which yields a model 20 inches long. While that is on the small side, it is still big enough to be converted to RC. (I've seen people convert the little Lindberg kit, which is only a foot long.)



The new Merit kit is a late war boat, with the upgraded weapons fit. They have announced that they plan to next release an early war boat, with decals to allow you to do any boat in the PT-103 class

Hospital Ship kit: From the UK, Deans Marine has just released a 1/96 scale kit of the St. Olaf, a WW2 US Navy Hospital Ship. The model is 55 inches long.



From the Deans Marine website: This attractive model with a length of 1.4m, beam of 385mm makes into a super detailed replica of the ship, with all of its cluttered appearance. It has lots of carrying capacity for the largest nicads to please those who like a long sail together with plenty of room inside for adding smoke, sound, and if ever a model would show of her lights, this has got to be the one. The kit lists for \$395 GBP on the Deans website.
