Editor's Notes

Simple Sound System: "BenVK", a modeler from the UK, posted this idea on the RCGroups.com Scale Boats forum. He took a small wireless (bluetooth) speaker and mounted it in his model. He then used his smartphone to play his music and audio sound effects files through this remote speaker. Bluetooth typically has a range of about 20-30 feet, which should be fine. If the model is close enough to the shore to hear it, it should be in range of the broadcasting source in your pocket!

These remote speakers are widely available and cheap. Here's an example—it is a 5 watt system that is 2 ½ inches in diameter, and 2 inches tall.
