Regatta Events

Navigation Course

Large Models: Models longer than 36 inches

Small Models: Models 36 inches and under

Visiting Skippers: Run one of our loaner tugs. Must be age 12 or older.

Scale Judging Classes

Military: Vessels operated by a Government entity, whether armed or not.

Workboats: Commercial vessels of any type- tugs, fishing, passenger carrying, etc.

Pleasure: Models of privately owned yachts and other pleasure craft.

Placement in a class will be determined by the model's markings. In the event of a question, the head judge will make the determination.

Registration will run from 9-11 am. Skipper's meeting will be at 1100, with static and Navigation Course judging running concurrently. Our goal is to have the awards ceremony at 3:30, but that will depend on the number of entries.

Entry Fees: \$5 per model. \$3 for Visiting Skippers event.

Rules:

1. This is an event for Radio Controlled models—there is no display-only class. Models must be operated on the water in order to be eligible for an award. (Scale judging includes an on-the-water component.)
2. Decisions of judges are final.
3. All boats must use a surface-legal radio frequency. Boats on other frequencies will not be allowed to run.
4. Due to park regulations, no internal combustion engines are allowed.
5. Models may be entered in the Scale Judging or Navigation Course, or both.
6. Models entered in the Scale Judging classes must have been built by the entrant.
7. There is no "builder of the model" rule for the Navigation course.
